


Catholic Schools' Week – Jan 29-Feb 4, 2023



Today marks the beginning of Catholic Schools' Week (CSW). The theme this year is Seeking Truth, Healing, and Reconciliation. In the beatitudes, Jesus gives a new twist to words like poverty, meekness and mercy. These look like weakness-



es, but they can become the source of goodness. The whole eight beatitudes are a vast topic. Just let's focus on these three sources of power for goodness-poverty, meekness and mercy.

- The truly poor man, in Jesus' sense of the word is the man who not only is helpless but who also recognizes his helplessness and then takes the next step of placing his trust in God. Such a person is willing to accept the will of God. It's the doing of God's will that is the coming of his kingdom.. Doing his will is our peace.
- The word "meek" and even the word "gentle" are sometimes considered flabby words to the modern ear. In the beatitudes, however, meekness is a virtue mid-way between recklessness and cowardice. The meek man is the man who is willing to learn, who is willing to accept God's guidance. The person who is meek enough to learn God's ways of doing things is someone who will possess his or her life in security; they will possess the earth.

We often use the word merciful with a note of condescension, pretentiousness, and helpfulness to someone who does not quite deserve help. But merciful in Scripture is the quality that God shows to mankind. The man or woman who is merciful is the one who treats others as God treats them: with an outgoing love and concern. Mercy rests on the willingness to see things from other people's point of view, to see their side of the story. Mercy has that happy result that the person who persists in seeing other's viewpoints and in being compassionate in the long run finds that others show him the same understanding and compassion.

The beatitudes sound like a big deal, far too demanding for us to undertake. But if we look carefully at the lives of those who live them, they are evident in the little details of life. The man who tries every way he knows to tackle a problem, but also finds time to pray "Lord I don't know what to do" is a poor man, who knows his own inability. The woman who is angry not in a selfish but an altruistic way, not destructive but saving; not wounding but healing, such is the meek person. People who check themselves from gossiping and criticizing are merciful.

Poverty, meekness and mercy are special qualities but they begin from incompetence, weakness and suffering. We all have these weaknesses to begin with. Like Moses, we can struggle to make them into strength. Jesus' beatitudes are a promise that we can perform the struggle with our own strength and his.
